# "You're 59, Repeat Again"

One of the most basic components of virtually any ham radio contact is the signal report, consisting of Readability on a scale of 1 to 5, Signal Strength from 1 to 9 (to X dB over 9), and for CW, Tone quality from 1 to 9 -- the common RS(T). Spend any time in a contest, however, and you notice quickly that everybody is 59 (or for CW, 5NN).

Certainly conditions can't be that great for everybody in the contest, and you'll often see "59" stations being asked for repeats of the contest exchange, which you wouldn't expect if, at the far end, their Readability was excellent and Signal Strength very strong.

There's occasional opposition to this notion, people who think that contest signal reports should be done exactly the same as any other QSO, based on the readability and strength (usually from the S-meter) at the receiving station. I once held this notion and gave my share of 55, 58, and even occasional 42 reports in contests; I've changed my ways now and give exclusively 59s, after understanding why and how it is the way it is.

Certainly the RST in a contest exchange is meaningless. Virtually all contest logging software auto-fills 599, because everybody gives 599. It could be argued that, since it's meaningless, it should either be removed universally or replaced with something else unique and nonpredictable, like one of the components of the Sweepstakes exchange, or model of transmitter, or perhaps even current outdoor temperature. That would, after all, increase the challenge.

The 59, though, serves a meaningful purpose, and should remain in contest exchanges. It serves the purpose of synchronization, of signaling that what immediately follows is the part of the exchange to write or type. If the exchange is repeated (in poor practice usually, but still done sometimes), it separates the two transmissions of exchange. It also serves, on the one side, to indicate the calling station is satisfied it has received the running station's exchange, and also it serves to somewhat prevent long VOX delays from masking the first part of the exchange. Perhaps most importantly, though, we should still give 59s in contests because that's what everyone else is accustomed to hearing. Sending any other report, or eliminating it, changes the contest rhythm that everybody is long accustomed to.

So when you work that VK long-path in CQWW next week and get a 59 back, you can be assured the odds are against your being S-9 on the Australian's meter. He's probably not S-9 on your meter either, but you both heard each other (with sufficient readability and signal strength to be sure it's a good contact), and that's what really matters. You both log 59 (or 599 in the CW or RTTY contest), and everything is good and well in the universe.

## **Volunteers Needed to Help Test Warning Sirens**

If you live or work in Arlington, chances are you have heard the wail of one of our warning sirens. In the event of severe weather, these sirens going off might save your life. But, what if they did not go off? Where would we be then?

Volunteer observers, working in conjunction with the Arlington Fire Department, Office of Emergency Management, assist in the testing of the city's sirens on the first Wednesday of each month, weather permitting. Observers monitor and report on the RC repeater, K5SLD, 147.140 MHz, pl 110.9. There are provisions for call-in reports from non-ham observers as well.

If you have the time available, we would love to enlist your cooperation and radio expertise in this most necessary and rewarding effort. Your report of a malfunctioning siren just might mean the saving of a life or avoidance of bodily injury.

Siren observer lists are emailed to known participants 1 to 2 days in advance. Please monitor our 147.140 repeater starting about 11:45am. on the day of the test. Announcements begin at 12:15pm pm., and the formal net opens about 12:45pm on test day. All observers should be on location and checked in by that time. Testing begins at 1:00pm and is usually concluded by 1:20pm. You may join us at any time that you are able. Detailed maps in PDF and printed formats will be available upon request to assist you in locating the sirens. We particularly need observers in the western and southern parts of Arlington.
