The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30pm September 19th, 2014 by the President, Sherry W5YUP. Other board members present included the Vice President, David KB3UBD; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF. Absent were the Treasurer, Joyce W5FJB; and Editor, Dennis N5ACK.

Sherry W5YUP called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes for the August meetings were submitted for publication in the September 2014 newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Joyce W5FJB was not present, so voting on the approval of the treasurer's report was postponed until the following meeting.

Phil N5PWW continues to hold test sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month. The Technician Class training session held at USMD has concluded. He reported that the club's electric generator, which stopped functioning at Field Day, can not be fixed in way that is economically feasible. A motion was made and carrier to allocate the sum of \$300 which Phil may spend at his discretion to replace the electric generator.

Maurice KM5RF reported that the repeater is in working order. The IRLP is now working, after repairs were made. The club's license is up to date.

Bill AE5BT reported that the Boy Scouts of America event known as Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) will be held on Saturday, October 18th.

Rob May NV5E, having been appointed as the nominating committee chair, informed the membership that officer elections will be held at the November membership meeting. All offices are voted upon. The current President, Vice President, and Treasurer will not be seeking re-election for those offices.

A break was taken at 8:07pm.

Meeting resumed at 8:20pm with a presentation on the National Traffic System by Jo Ann Keith, KA5AZK.

The meeting adjourned at 9:25pm. The sign-in sheet showed 23 people in attendance, 22 indicating AARC membership.
