From the President:

As we get closer to the "real" spring season, it is time to start looking at what we can do this year as a club to reach our goal of more fun and increased member participation. I have reviewed the results of last month's survey and feel there are several things we can focus on. First, I would like to discuss what activity or celebration we can put together for our 60th anniversary. I would like to try for something in Late May or early July. During other activities we can also promote the 60th anniversary, such as a special sign or announcement as part of our Field Day program.Based on the survey results and what I would like to see the club accomplish over the next year, here are some thoughts to ponder:

- 1) The club membership is eager for more fun activities. Therefore, I would like to discuss some specific ideas and possibly form a committee that would be responsible for planning activities throughout the year. I think the first big activity to focus on is a 60th anniversary party. I also think that we should plan something like a fox-hunt for April or May.
- 2) The monthly programs are doing well, and we will continue to do our best to come up with interesting and informative presentations. I will discuss with the Vice President some of the ideas presented in the surveys.
- 3) Members agree that we should communicate more with other clubs and plan a joint activity. There may be an opportunity to have a joint activity, and we may want to invite other clubs to attend our 60th anniversary party.
- 4) While the club was agreeable to ambivalent about forming a membership committee, I think we should setup such a committee and have them focus on membership drives and welcoming new members. The committee may also be able to plan fund-raising activities.
- 5) I think we will leave membership dues alone for now, and try the fund-raising route if we need more funds for activities and programs.
- 6) The membership is very agreeable to more participation in community service and emergency services. We should discuss some ways we can participate and put together a presentation about RACES / ARES. There are other ways we can help the community, and we will discuss some ideas over the next couple of meetings. I am anxious to get started on the year's planning, particularly since we are already in March. Before you know it, the year will be half over. Let's roll up our sleeves and get busy this month! I look forward to a great year!

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:31pm February 20th, 2015 by the President, David KB3UBD. Absent were the Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and the Editor, Dennis N5ACK.

David KB3UBD called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Terry KD5RA reported that tonight he and three member volunteers would conduct the financial audit of the records pertaining to 2014. Terry also reported that the tax forms for 2014 have been filed. The financial information published in the January newsletter was not the correct information. The March newsletter will contain the January and February information and will be reviewed at the March membership meeting.
