Misc. Club Info and Annoucements

Unlike many organizations of which you may be a member, yearly membership dues for AARC cover the calendar year (January 1st through December 31st). That's why, after July 1st, dues for new members (not renewing current members) are reduced to half the yearly amount. In the past we have simply dropped members from the club roster and email distribution lists in July if they had been a member in the prior year but had not renewed by July of the present year. This year we wanted to give a heads-up to members who have not renewed. There are presently about 20 members on the roster who were carried forward from 2014 but have not yet paid dues for calendar year 2015. If you are not sure if you paid dues for 2015 and wish to remain as a member of the club please contact the club's treasurer, Terry Lines, for your dues status. It is not likely, but it is possible, that you paid dues and the payment was not properly noted. This year we plan to drop members from the roster in the beginning of August so if you do not receive the August newsletter but had been receiving the prior editions in all likelihood you were dropped from the club's roster. If this occurs and you wish to reinstate your membership please contact Terry Lines immediately.

Here is an item from Mark Chronister, N5LFE.

This month, I will mixing ham radio with one of my other passions, bicycling. I will be doing a 7-day bicycle ride (starting 7/19) across Iowa called RAGBRAI XLIII with over 10,000 other cyclists. RAGBRAI (Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa) is not a "race." Rather, it might be considered a 7-day tour and rolling party for pie, corn and pork-chop eating enthusiasts that have a cycling problem. I will likely put about 500 miles on the bike during this trip. The ride will overwhelm both the road and all types of communications infrastructure along much of the route. This is the fourth time that I have ridden this, having also done it in 2011, 2012 and 2014. This is a border to border ride that, by tradition, starts with dipping the rear wheel of the bike in the Missouri River and ends with dipping the front wheel in the mighty Mississippi River.

My bicycle will be equipped with VHF/UHF amateur radio, APRS and GPS. Depending on radio coverage, it may be possible to track my location/progress near real-time on a Google map via APRS at: http://aprs.fi/?timerange=604800&call=N5LFE-7. The Google "street view" may give you some idea of what I see, minus the cyclists. Iowa is rural and quite hilly, which will affect how well this works. Past results have ranged from poor to excellent, depending upon the route which is different each year. This year will probably be somewhere toward the middle of that range. Radio coverage is expected to be best in the eastern half of the state (ride is west to east). The mapping is a "connect the data points" algorithm, so if there is missing data, I might appear to cut across a field or something that did not really happen, but it works fairly well. Location/packet transmissions are triggered both by turns and on a periodic schedule with the rate varied by travel speed.

The radio is a Kenwood TH-D72A 2m/70cm HT with integral GPS and TNC. Transmit power will be 5 watts (on 144.390 MHz for APRS) into a Larsen NMO-2/70 ½ -wave antenna that is mounted to the rear of my road bike saddle with a homebrew bracket (The bike frame is all carbon fiber, so I can't clamp anything to it.) Both voice and APRS operation is possible on the full-duplex radio, which is carried in a small handlebar bag. Most voice operation at RAGBRAI is on 146.520 MHz simplex, although repeaters are scattered along the route. I use a speaker/mic and place it on a short leash so that it can't fall into the spokes if I drop it. A small number of other amateur radio operators (loosely organized as the unofficial "Team Megacycles") usually participates in this event, so this may add another dimension to the experience with occasional QSO's. It also makes for good conversation with other curious non-ham riders on the road. I've been asked all sorts of questions in the past, including if the antenna helps my cellphone reception (which is quite poor, generally.) Battery charging will be available at our camp each

evening and I have two battery packs for the radio, so I can generally make it through the entire day.

June 2015 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30pm on June 19th, 2015 by the President, David KB3UBD. Other board members present included the Vice President, Linda W5LMC; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer, Terry KD5RA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Editor, Dennis N5ACK; and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF.

David KB3UBD called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes for the May meetings were submitted for publication in the June 2015 newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Terry KD5RA reviewed the treasurer's report from the month of May. A motion was made and carried to accept for audit the financial report as published.

Phil N5PWW continues to hold test sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10am. He will not hold a test session on July 4th. There are no training classes currently being conducted. A new pool of exam questions for the General Class exam will go into effect on July 1st.

Dennis N5ACK published the June 2015 newsletter and brought additional copies to the meeting.

Maurice KM5RF reported that the new repeaters will receive a firmware upgrade in July. With the remaining allocated money for the repeater upgrade, a repeater amplifier will be purchased for the 2-m repeater. He recommended the club purchase ARRL repeater insurance to cover the new system. The motion was made and carried to purchase the insurance.

Linda W5LMC mentioned that the July meeting will feature a presentation on DXing from Costa Rica, and the August meeting will be the ice cream social. Siren testing continues on the first Wednesday of each month.

A break was taken at 8:00pm. At 8:10 pm the meeting resumed with Bill AE5BT presenting the plans for Field Day. Setup of the stations and antennas will start at 9am. Anyone can visit and operate the equipment as there will be supervising control operators. Dinner is planned for 6pm on Saturday and the membership is encouraged to bring a side-dish to complement the BBQ main course.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45pm. The sign-in sheet showed 34 people in attendance, 30 indicating AARC membership.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on June 19th, 2015 at 6:34pm. Present were President, David KB3UBD; Vice President, Linda W5LMC; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer, Terry KD5RA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Editor, Dennis N5ACK; and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF.

Terry submitted the financial report for May for publication in the newsletter. He reviewed the report with the board. The CD will be rolled over.

Phil will not hold a test session on July 4th. A new pool of test questions goes into effect on July 1st for the General Class exam.

Linda informed the board that the presentation for next month will be on the topic of DXing.

Maurice reported that the new repeater is running, working well, and being used for siren testing. The amount of \$1600 was allocated for the new repeater, with \$1000 spent. The sum of \$550 will be spent on a repeater amplifier. Maurice recommended that the membership be asked to purchase repeater insurance, costing approximately \$55/year, from the ARRL to cover the new repeater. A motion to bring the matter before the membership was made and carried.

Bill reviewed his plans for Field Day.

The meeting adjourned at 7:17pm.
