Meeting Minutes

March 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on March 16th, 2018 by the President, Rob NV5E. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes for the February meetings were submitted for publication in the March newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF submitted the treasurer's report for publication in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept for audit the report as published.

Maurice reported that last month the audit committee completed the audit of the 2017 financial records. As repeater trustee, he reported that the repeaters are in working order. He would like to make an upgrade to the UHF repeater by adding an RF amplifier. Maurice will collect specific information on the cost of the project and provide a detailed proposal to the membership at the April meeting.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that the evening's presentation would be a video regarding the 1992 amateur radio expedition to South Sandwich Island. The presentation in April will be a remote (via Skype) presentation by Gordon West on the topic of emergency communications. The topic in May will be antennas.

Bill AE5BT reminded the membership that Field Day 2018 will be held on Saturday and Sunday, June 23-24.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. He thanked those who provided contributions to the March newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey no later than the Sunday before the club meeting.

David Spore KB3UBD, as Membership Committee Chair, has organized a club picnic at River Legacy Park in May. It will be an opportunity to eat delicious food and get on the radio. If you would like to join the Membership Committee, contact David.

Rob NV5E mentioned that new AARC repeater net held its first check-in last month. The second installment of the net will be held tomorrow, the Saturday following the club meeting, at 7 pm on the 147.14 repeater. He also mentioned that the AARC participation in the ARRL International DX contest was a success.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance).

A break was taken at 8:10 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:20 pm with an introduction by Steve Bennett KD5ZD on the video of the 1992 DXpedition to South Sandwich Island.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 32 people in attendance, 29 indicating AARC membership.

Rob NV5E noted that new AARC repeater net was held last month and that the next iteration will be held tomorrow. The AARC made 100 contacts representing 50 countries during participation in the ARRL International DX contest.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the February meeting minutes to Trey for publication in the March newsletter.




Michael Griffin
