For one thing there was no problem finding the program of your choice, and since each class was presented multiple times there was no worry about missing something interesting.



Our old friend Bob Ballard KG5SQJ was there giving his popular talk on manually programming Baofeng HTs , and Mary KG5URO, who had invited me along to Mentorfest, had brought hers along to program. I enjoyed the program on AREDN - emergency MESH network - by Bill Richards KM5VZ. I'm hoping to have him or one of his colleagues present for us at Arlington ARC later this year. # **Meeting Minutes**

# April 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:31 pm on April 20th, 2018 by the President, Rob NV5E. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Maurice KM5RF submitted the treasurer's report for publication in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

Maurice reported that the club's web page was moved to a different hosting company to save the club money.

As repeater trustee, he reported that the repeaters are in working order. He would like to make an upgrade to the UHF repeater by adding an RF amplifier. Maurice provided two options. The first option was to purchase an amplifier with a 40 watt output, and the second option having a 70 watt output. A motion was made and carried to purchase the 70 watt amplifier and transfer \$300 from the general fund to the repeater fund to cover the cost.

The minutes for the March meetings were submitted for publication in the April newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Bill AE5BT reminded the membership that Field Day 2018 will be held on Saturday and Sunday, June 23-24. Assistance will be needed to setup the stations on Saturday morning, starting at 9 am, along with packing up the stations on Sunday around 11 am.

A dinner is planned for Saturday at 6 pm and the membership is asked to bring a side dish, for example, ice, drinks, salad, or potato salad.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that the evening's presentation would be a live Skype presentation by Gordon West. She also reminded the membership of the AARC repeater net held on the Saturday following the club meeting, at 7 pm on the 147.14 repeater.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance). There are no plans for training sessions at this time. If anyone is interested in attending CW classes, contact Phil.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey no later than the Sunday before the club meeting.

David Spore KB3UBD, as Membership Committee Chair, has been collecting member biography information for publication in the newsletter. He has also organized a club picnic at River Legacy Park on Saturday, May 19th. There will be hamburgers, hot dogs, and radios.

Rob NV5E mentioned that the new AARC repeater net held its second check-in last month. The third

installment of the net will be held tomorrow, The Saturday following the club meeting, at 7 pm on the 147.14 repeater.

Cindy Mohat KE5DQG (representative of the Police at UTA) presented David Walker W5DJO and Maurice Martin KM5RF with the Partnership Award for providing assistance in achieving "Storm Ready" certification.

A break was taken at 8:12 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:33 pm with a live Skype presentation by Gordon West on real amateur radio emergency communications.

The meeting adjourned at 9:03 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 33 people in attendance, 28 indicating AARC membership.
