Meeting Minutes

August 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on August 17th, 2018 by the President, Rob NV5E. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was the Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order and suggested the everyone serve themselves a bowl of ice cream before it melted. After getting settled into their seats with desserts in hand, Rob asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes for the July meetings were submitted for publication in the August newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. He informed the membership of the spurious emission that he detected on the output frequency of the 2-meter repeater. He determined the source of the emission to be located at Ceder Hill.

Virginia NV5F has not yet planned a presentation for September. In October she will have a program on the Puerto Rico hurricane assistance trip, presented by Valeria Hotzfeld via Skype. November will be the election of club officers.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance). There is a training session planned for August 21st-23rd, at NCTTRAC (North Central Texas Trauma Regional Advisory Council). More than 40 participants are expected. An exam will be given on August 23rd, and Phil requested the assistance of a few more VEs on that day from 1 pm to 3 pm.

David Walker W5DJO informed the membership that he retired from the voluntary position in which he assisted the City of Arlington with the monthly emergency siren testing. He thanked those whom had assisted with the siren testing in the past.

On behalf of Bill AE5BT, Rob NV5E informed the membership of the plan to utilize a beam antenna for operations during Field Day 2019. If anyone has access or knows of someone with access to a lift/bucket truck which could be used during that weekend to erect a beam antenna to a height of 25 to 30 feet, please contact Bill. On Saturday, October 20th, 2018, Bill is planning on participating in Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch. The club can also set up a station in Arlington if someone is interested in doing so.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey starting the first weekend of the month.

Mary KG5URO, on behalf of David Spore KB3UBD, Membership Committee chair, informed the membership

of David's plans to have a club camping trip to be held at Cedar Hill State Park on the weekend of October 12th-14th. Participants should make their own reservations.

The meeting adjourned at 8:22 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 29 people in attendance, 27 indicating AARC membership.

August 2018 Executive Board Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on August 17th, 2018 at 6:32 pm. Present were President, Rob NV5E; Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order.

Rob mentioned that he was happy with the amount of participation in the Wednesday 2-meter net and the efforts put forth by David Spore as chair of the Membership Committee.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the July meeting minutes to Trey for publication in the August newsletter.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report with the board. The bill for the storage locker will be arriving soon. He will also write a check to reimburse Virginia for the AARC business cards she purchased. He reported detecting a spurious emission which was effecting the 2-meter repeater on the output frequency. Using direction finding techniques, he narrowed down the location of the emission to the antennas on Cedar Hill. He contacted the tower operator and informed them of his findings.

Virginia NV5F informed the board that tonight's program would be the annual ice cream social and slide show. She is trying to organize a program of September. For October she will have Valeria Hotzfeld NV9L tell the club, via Skype, about her trip to Puerto Rico to provide assistance after the hurricane.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month. He will hold a training session next week, at the NCTTRAC location. The session will be for the Technician Class license running for 3 weekdays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. There are 46 people who have committed to attending the class. Phil will need a few VEs to assist with administering and grading the exams on August 23rd.

Bill AE5BT reported the scouting event known as Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) will be held on Saturday, October 23rd, and Bill is planning on participating at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch. If you would like to participate, contact Bill.

Trey AF5XS published and distributed the newsletter.
