That's it for me this time. I'm looking forward to some nice weather and great times ahead!



## Meeting Minutes

### **February 2019 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary**

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:37 pm on February 15th, 2019 by the President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance). Participants in the testing sessions will be required to have an email address and their FRN to complete their FCC forms. He offers Morse code training, both prior to and following the testing session, to those who are interested.

The question pool for the General exam will change on July 1st.

Phil noted that the ARRL no longer includes emergency communications as one of their main objectives.

Mary AE6Q reported that this evening George Burger W0PHX will give a presentation via video conference from Minnesota on the contests Summits on the Air, and World Wide Flora & Fauna.

At the March meeting, the kit-building editor of CQ magazine will speak to the club via Skype on the topic of building kits. The April meeting will include a presentation on amateur radio satellites.

Virginia NV5F noted that the presenter for the March meeting might be brought to Arlington in a following month if the membership is interested funding travel expenses for an in person kit-building experience. Virginia made the membership aware of a request by the organizers of the Arlington Heroes Parade for assistance during the parade.

The minutes for the January meetings were submitted for publication in the February newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Bill AE5BT let the membership know that Field Day 2019 was only 127 days away, being held on the weekend of June 22nd. Assistance from the membership to set up equipment on Saturday morning, and pack up on early Sunday afternoon is greatly appreciated.

Bill AE5BT informed the membership that last month he received a request from an organization to provide a presentation on amateur radio for a group of blind youths. There were no new developments in regard to the request, such as a specific date.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey starting the first weekend of the month.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. He paid for the ARRL equipment insurance for the repeater, and added the new amplifier to the list of covered equipment. Maurice also renewed the web hosting for the AARC web site. This evening the audit committee will review the 2018 financial records.

A break was taken at 8:15 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:20 pm with a presentation on Summits on the Air, and World Wide Flora & Fauna, given by George Burger W0PHX.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 25 people in attendance, 23 indicating AARC membership.

### **February 2019 Executive Board Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary**

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on February 15th, 2019 at 6:36 pm. Present were President, Virginia NV5F; Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW, and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. He is planning on offering a training class for the General Class exam after the new question pool goes in to effect on July 1st of this year. Phil informed the board that people attending the testing sessions are now required to bring their FRN.

Phil has some historical documents pertaining to the club which he would like to contribute to David Spore's KB3UBD archiving effort.

Mary AE6Q informed the board that the evening's presentation will be given by George Burger W0PHX on the topics of World Wide Flora & Fauna, and Summits on the Air. Future presentations will include ham radio kit building, noise floor RFI, and working amateur radio satellites.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report with the board. He submitted the 990 tax form, added the new repeater amplifier to the insurance, and renewed the web hosting for another year.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the January meeting minutes to Trey for publication in the February newsletter.

Bill AE5BT reported that there were no new developments in regard to the request he received from an organization to provide a presentation on amateur radio for a group of blind youths.

Trey AF5XS printed and distributed the newsletter.

Virginia NV5F informed the board that she received a letter from the organizers of the Arlington Heroes Parade. They would like to know if the AARC would be able to provide radio communication assistance for the event. In regard to the upcoming kit-building presentation via Skype scheduled for March, Virginia would like to assess the interest of the membership in funding an in person visit by the presenter.

The meeting adjourned at 7:20 pm.
