## **Meeting Minutes**

#### August 2019 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The membership started eating ice cream at 7:30 pm on August 16, 2019.

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:58 pm by the President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Bill AE5BT informed the membership that 316 days remained until the start of Field Day 2020. Two scouting related amateur radio opportunities will be available in the next couple of months. Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) will be held in October. The membership can visit the Sid Richardson Scout Ranch to set up a station, or perhaps set up one in Arlington. In November the Longhorn Council will conduct their Camporee at Texas Motor Speedway. The club could set up a station on November 9th from 10 am to 4 pm and allow scouts to experience ham radio.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

Phil N5PWW continues to organize testing sessions at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. There are no training classes at this time.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. Submissions of content are welcomed.

Virginia NV5F reported that after the summer time activities, she and Mary AE6Q will work on organizing a kit building project and possibly a fox hunt for the membership.

Mary AE6Q informed the membership of the future presentations that have been arranged. In September, Terry W0JRH will give a presentation on Morse code, accompanied by a demonstration of different types of keys.

The presentation in October will be on the topic of Summits on the Air (SOTA), followed by AARC officer

elections and a show-and-tell in November.

Virginia, Mary, and Kathleen KG5CVO are organizing a soldering and robot building kit activity for the membership.

Virginia informed the membership of two opportunities to provide assistance with radio communication. The Walk to end Alzheimer's will be held on October 5th on the southeast campus of Tarrant County College. The Arlington Heroes Parade will be held on November 9th.

The meeting adjourned at 8:25 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 21 people in attendance, 18 indicating AARC membership.
