Meeting Minutes

September 2019 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on September 20th, 2019 at 7:33 pm by the President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Absent was Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that the scheduled presenter had to cancel, and that she would provide a presentation on slow scan television.

She has been contacted regarding two opportunities to provide communication assistance. On October 5th the Walk to end Alzheimer's is being held on the southeast campus of Tarrant County College. On November 9th the Arlington Heroes Parade will march through Arlington. At last month's meeting, Bill AE5BT mentioned that also on November 9th the Longhorn Council will conduct their Camporee at Texas Motor Speedway and provide an opportunity for the AARC to allow scouts to experience amateur radio.

Virginia was contacted by Chair of the Membership Committee, David Spore KB3UBD, requesting that an additional club member volunteer to sit on the committee. Virginia is looking for a volunteer to fill the appointed position of Public Information Officer. The PIO keeps the AARC in the public eye. She is working on organizing a kit building project and possibly a fox hunt in late fall for the membership.

Virginia was contacted by the Young Ladies Radio League (YLRL)-District 5 regarding the hosting/organization of a kit build project. Virginia mentioned that the event would be held on a Saturday in January.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the minutes from the August meetings for publication in the September newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the August minutes as published.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. Submissions of content are welcomed.

Mary AE6Q thanked Virginia for providing a presentation on short notice. Mary reviewed the future presentations that have been arranged. The presentation in October will be on the topic of Radio in the

Park, followed by AARC officer elections and a show-and-tell in November.

Phil N5PWW continues to provide testing sessions at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. There are no training classes at this time.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

A break was taken at 8:04 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:18 pm with a presentation on the first steps to get involved with slow scan television, given by Virginia.

The meeting adjourned at 8:47 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 25 people in attendance, 22 indicating AARC membership.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on September 20th, 2019 at 6:31 pm. Present were President, Virginia NV5F; Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF. Absent were Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order. She noted that she was contacted about two opportunities to provide communication assistance. The first event is the Walk to end Alzheimer's held on October 5th on the southeast campus of Tarrant County College. The second event is the Arlington Heroes Parade held on November 9th. The YLRL-District 5 contacted her about hosting a kit building project in January.
