FCC Orders Amateur Access to 3.5 GHz Band to "Sunset"


Despite vigorous and continuing opposition from ARRL and others, the FCC has ordered the "sunset" of the 3.3 - 3.5 GHz amateur radio secondary spectrum allocation. The decision allows current amateur activity on the band to continue, "grandfathering" the amateur operations subject to a later decision. The FCC proposed two deadlines for amateur operations to cease on the band. The first would apply to the 3.4 - 3.5 GHz segment, the second to 3.3 - 3.4 GHz. The FCC will establish the dates once it reviews additional comments.

"We adopt our proposal from the *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* to remove the amateur allocation from the 3.3 - 3.5 GHz band," the FCC said in its *Report and Order*. "[W]e adopt changes to our rules today that provide for the sunset of the secondary amateur allocation in the band, but allow continued use of the band for amateur operations, pending resolution of the issues raised in the *Further Notice*."

The *Report and Order* ([R&O](#)) and *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* in WT Docket No. 19-348 adopted on September 30

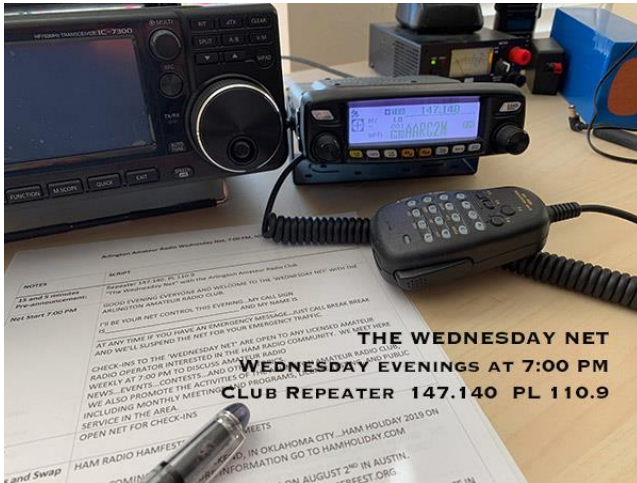

Meeting Minutes

September 2020 Membership Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was held via teleconference and called to order on September 18th, 2020 at 7:32 pm by the President, David K5NN. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order. He asked Jack Weaver AA5VZ to give a brief 'Behind the call sign' presentation.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that David Cripe NM0S would be presenting the evening's program on a WWII prisoner of war camp convert canteen radio. She will provide a program in October on the topic of radio astronomy, as related to the radio telescope project with which she is involved. Election of club officers will be held in November, and may be accompanied by a show-and-tell or a presentation.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the September newsletter contained the minutes from the August meeting. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report as it appeared in the September newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. Maurice will wait until November to coordinate access to the repeater site for installation of the new repeater.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for September.

Phil N5PWW reported that there are no training classes being held at this time. He continues to provide testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use north side entrance). Three people have confirmed their attendance at the next session.

Bill AE5BT reported that 281 days remained until the start of Field Day 2021. JOTA (Jamboree on the Air), the amateur radio scouting event, will be held in October. Score-O will be held at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch on the same weekend. In the past, the club has traveled to SRSR to set up an amateur radio station to allow scouts to experience the amateur radio hobby. Due to the risk of COVID exposure, Bill will not be participating. Club members can individually participate from their homes if they wish.

David K5NN did not receive a response to his request to accept a donation of a crank-up tower.

A break was taken at 7:59 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:05 pm with a presentation by David Cripe on the history of a WWII canteen radio used in a prisoner of war camp, and his experience in replicating the radio using vintage parts in the present day.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 pm. The teleconference attendance screen showed 16 people in attendance, 14 being AARC members.

September 2020 Executive Board Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held via teleconference on September 18th, 2020 at 6:38 pm. Present were President, David K5NN; Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order.
He has not received a response from his inquiry requesting a donation of a crank-up tower.

Virginia NV5F informed the board that the evening's program on a canteen radio in a prisoner of war camp during WWII would be presented by David Cripe. Virginia will provide a program in October on the topic of radio astronomy. November will see the election of club officers for 2021. A show-and-tell or presentation may follow the election.

Andy KB2VQA confirmed that the September newsletter contained the minutes from the August meetings.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report published in the September newsletter. He paid the rent on the storage unit and received a payment from the Amazon Smiles program.
He will coordinate a time in November to gain access to the repeater site to install the new DR-2 repeater.

Trey AF5XS published the September newsletter.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. Three people have confirmed that they will attend the next test session, with an additional four confirming their attendance at the following test session. There are no training classes in session at this time.

Bill AE5BT informed the board that JOTA (Jamboree on the Air) and Score-O will be taking place in October at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch. In the past, the club has set up stations to introduce scouts to the hobby of amateur radio. Bill recommended that the club not visit SRSR as the risk of exposure to COVID was still too high. The club could participate by setting up a station in the parking lot of 401 W. Sanford Street, or from the homes of club members.

The meeting adjourned at 7:03 pm.
