




Club Net

Meeting Minutes

June 2021 Membership Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on June 18th, 2021 at 7:32 pm by the President, David K5NN, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Other board members present included Vice President, Jack AA5VZ; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order.

Jack AA5VZ informed the membership this month's presentation would be provided by Rob W5WS on the history of Field Day, and how the AARC will participate this year. Next month's presentation will be on the topic of CW (Continuous Wave) by Virginia NV5F. The 'Getting Started...' series of presentations are available on the club's web site, including both the recorded teleconference and presentation slides.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the June newsletter contained the minutes from the May meetings. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report of May 2021. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. Maurice reported that the repeater is working well. He's planning to visit the repeater site in October to install the new repeater and remove the backup repeater that is currently in use. Maurice would like to conduct the annual audit of the club's financial records, covering the year 2020. He's seeking three volunteers to participate in the audit, being held at Field Day.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for June 2021. All submissions are welcomed, and requested to be received by the Saturday before the club meeting.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use the entrance on the north side). At the time of taking an exam, the FCC requires those taking the exam have an FCC Registration Number (FRN) and email address on file. The \$35 FCC fee increase is on hold.

Bill AE5BT announced that Field Day 2021 was 8 days away. The BBQ dinner on the Saturday of Field Day has been confirmed. He asks the membership to bring such side dishes as beans, potato salad, and fruit salad. Bill will invite the local fire station to dinner. Assistance will be needed at 1 pm on Sunday to take down and pack up the equipment.

Philip KD5WDW, the Public Information Officer, would like to collect information from club members who volunteer at various events. Please include the name of the event, location, and date.

Philip successfully received a proclamation from the City of Arlington declaring the weekend of Field Day 2021 as 'Arlington Amateur Radio Club and Amateur Radio Operators Recognition Days'.

At 8:15 pm Rob W5WS presented a program on the decades long history of Field Day and how the AARC will participate in Field Day 2021.

The meeting adjourned at 9:06 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 23 people in attendance plus 2 people via teleconference. All 25 attendees were AARC members.

June 2021 Executive Board Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on June 18th, 2021 at 6:34 pm, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Present were President, David K5NN; Vice President, Jack AA5VZ; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order. He received a second donation of amateur radio equipment from an estate.

Jack AA5VZ informed the board that the 'Getting Started...' presentations have been placed on the club's web site. This evening Rob W5WS will provide a program on the history of Field Day and specific information on how the club will participate in Field Day next weekend. Virginia NV5F will present a program on Continuous Wave (CW) at the July meeting. August will bring with it the ice cream social and show-n-tell.

Andy KB2VQA confirmed that the June newsletter contained the minutes from the May meetings.

Maurice KM5RF, reviewed the financial report published in the June 2021 newsletter. He plans to visit the repeater site in October to install the new repeater and remove the backup repeater that is currently in use. In preparation for Field Day, he has changed the oil in the electrical generator. He would like three volunteers to participate in the audit of the financial records for 2020. The audit will be held during Field Day.

Trey AF5XS published the June 2021 newsletter.

Phil N5PWW continues to hold testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. A test session will also be offered at Field Day. The new fee of \$35 for new licenses and upgrades will not go in to effect in July, as it is still going through the approval process. Training classes are not currently being held.

Bill AE5BT announced 8 days until Field Day.

Philip KD5WDW, the Public Information Officer, received a proclamation from the City of Arlington declaring the weekend of Field Day 2021 as 'Arlington Amateur Radio Club and Amateur Radio Operators Recognition Days'. He invited city council members to visit the club's Field Day location, and several have confirmed they will attend. The 9/11 Heroes Run is looking for volunteers.

The meeting adjourned at 7:13 pm.
