











Before long we were set-up and ready to get started.

Meeting Minutes

June 2023 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on June 16th, 2023, at 7:39 pm by the President, Jack AA5VZ. Other board members present included Vice President, Torre AA5CX; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Clayton K5CWS; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order, and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Jack informed the membership that dues for 2023 are being collect and due in January. The siren test was successful and there are some sirens in need of adoption. Jack thanked David Spore for the top-notch job he did in organizing the club picnic. Jack thanked Torre for chairing last month's meeting and providing the presentation. The program for tonight will be a discussion of Field Day activities.

Torre AA5CX is working on the finishing details of his terahertz presentation and plans on posting a video of it.

Philip KD5WDW, in the role of Public Information Officer, reported that he posted on Facebook an announcement of the club's upcoming Field Day activities.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the June newsletter contained the minutes from the May meetings. Bill AE5BT mentioned that two points mentioned by Randon WA5BEG did not appear in the minutes under 'new business'. Bill recalled that some Summit Racing Equipment locations have DX Engineering desks within the store, and that both companies are owned by the same corporation.

A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published with the additions that Bill noted.

Old business: David W5DJO mentioned that there is a need for volunteers to operate radio equipment that is installed in area hospitals.

New business: No new business was presented.

A break was taken at 8:18 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:30 pm with a discussion of Field Day activities.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 24 people in attendance, 23 indicating AARC

membership. Zoom attendees numbered 3.
