President's Corner

Chasing weather balloon is fun! I've always known they go up, but I had never looked into the particulars until this last month. It turns out our local National Weather Service office sends up at least two balloons a day, and they transmit on 404.8MHz once a second. It's the ultimate foxhunt! The balloon goes up, nobody knows exactly where it will come down, but once it does, it's all yours... if you can find it! Other radio amateurs figured out how to receive and decode the telemetry that comes from the payload. It conveniently gives you lat and lon (among other things). Some amateurs have even created software and hardware to automatically track, decode, and upload the data to the web (sondehub.org). On there you can find out where the balloon is going as well as all the other weather data that is coming from its payload. That's all cool in and of itself, but there's more! The NWS doesn't want its payload back! If you can find it, it's yours! Why would you want to find it? Because, if you want to, you can open up the payload, reprogram it, and do a variety of tinkering on your own. If anyone wants to take the plunge and start chasing, I'll be happy to show you!

Speaking of taking the plunge, if anyone wants to take the plunge and run for office, this is your opportunity to do it. Next month will be officer elections for the club, and everyone's job is up for grabs (including mine). We'll be appointing a nominating chair at this month's meeting, so if you'd like to be an officer in the AARC, let our soon-to-be-named chair know you'd like to run! Our tours normally last approximately 1 hour. Our facility is wheelchair accessible.

Joe K5MGY called the meeting to order and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Joe informed the membership that a test session would be held tomorrow and that the test team is present from 9 am to 10 am. He informed the membership of upcoming contests, and an amateur radio balloon launch by the Richardson club. Dining out has been changed from a monthly occurrence to a weekly occurrence.
