Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act Re-Introduced

Legislation Will Increase Communication Options During Natural Disasters

WASHINGTON – U.S. Senators Roger Wicker, R-Miss., and Richard Blumenthal, D-Conn., and Representatives August Pfluger, R-Tex., and Joe Courtney, D-Conn. announced their joint re-introduction of legislation in the Senate and House to restore the right to Amateur Radio operators to install the antennas necessary to serve their communities.

Homeowner association rules often prevent Amateur Radio operators from installing antennas at their homes even though Amateur Radio has proven to be essential in emergencies and natural disasters such as hurricanes when other means of communication fail

March 1: Testing - 10:00 am, 800 E. Border St., Arlington, TX 76010 The first commercial building west of Collins St on the south side.



The City of Arlington tests its outdoor warning sirens at 1:00 pm on the first Wednesday of each month, using volunteer observers, most of whom are hams reporting into a net held on the AARC's 2m repeater (147.140+, PL 110.9). Check-ins begin during the noon hour, and the test typically concludes before 1:30 pm. More observers are always needed, so please consider helping with this valuable effort if you can spare about an hour at lunchtime once a month.

Phil Stage was presented a plaque in recognition of being voted AARC 2024 Ham of the Year.

Price reminded the membership that AARC club dues are due on January 1st. He mentioned that David KB3UBD will be organizing the summer picnic for May 17th. Summer Field Day will be held on June 28th and 29th, and Clayton K5CWS will manage the club's participation. He is looking for volunteers to be on the Field Day planning committee.

Phil N5PWW mentioned that VE testing is now taking place at 800 East Border Street at 10 am.
