The City of Arlington tests its outdoor warning sirens at 1:00 pm on the first Wednesday of each month, using volunteer observers, most of whom are hams reporting into a net held on the AARC's 2m repeater (147.140+, PL 110.9). Check-ins begin during the noon hour, and the test typically concludes before 1:30 pm. More observers are always needed, so please consider helping with this valuable effort if you can spare about an hour at lunchtime once a month.

Price K5NNL called the meeting to order and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Price recognized club members who assisted with the club's participation in the library's Discover Summer Kickoff on Saturday, May 31st. The club meeting in July will again be held on the third floor of the library in the Excellence room. He thanked David Spore KB3UBD for paying for the pavilion rental and the meat, in support of the club picnic held in May.
